

ORDINANCE NO. 26

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THE ISSUANCE OF A LICENSE TO TRANSIENT PEDDLERS AND AUCTIONEERS AND RELATIVE TO THE AUTHORITY FOR FIXING THE AMOUNT OF LICENSES PROVIDED FOR IN ANY ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HUNTER WHERE THE AMOUNT IS NOT STATED OR ONLY FIXED BETWEEN THE LIMITS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEN OF THE CITY OF HUNTER:

SECTION 1. Any person who travels, from place to place and offers for sale or sells either at public auction or at private sale, any goods, wares, merchandise or other articles, shall before selling or offering such goods, wares, merchandise or articles for sale within the limits of the city of Hunter, obtain from the city clerk a license authorizing such sale and shall pay for such license the sum of from \$1.00 to \$25.00 for each day or part of day.

SECTION 2. Wherever in this ordinance or any other ordinance of the City of Hunter the amount of the license is not named or is only indicated between limits, the mayor, or in case of his absence, or if for any reason he cannot be found, the president of the council, together with the city clerk shall have the authority to fix the amount of such license.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city paper.
