

ORDINANCE NO. 27

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND SALE OF MILK AND CREAM IN THE CITY OF HUNTER.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEN OF THE CITY OF HUNTER, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. No person shall offer for sale or sell any milk or cream within the city of Hunter for domestic consumption without first having registered his name and place with the city clerk. The owner of each cow used for the sale of milk or cream shall register such cow with said city clerk with proper description and individual number. No cow shall be registered except such as has been inspected and tested for tuberculosis at least once a year by a registered Veterinary.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful to bottle milk or cream from other containers or transfer milk from one receptacle to another while enroute or to bottle in any place or room unfitted for that purpose. No milk or cream shall be sold from a cow until, five days after or fifteen days before giving birth to a calf.

SECTION 3. Any person found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine not less than five dollars \$5 or more than Twenty-five \$25 together with the cost of prosecution and in case any person is found guilty of a second violation of any of the provisions hereof shall be fined in the sum of not less than ten dollars \$10 or more than fifty \$50.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force ten days after its publication in the Hunter Herald.
