

ORDINANCE NO. 43

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CONTROL OF THE CITY DUMPING GROUND AND PERTAINING TO THE KIND OF RUBBISH THAT MAY BE DISPOSED OF AT THE CITY'S REGULARLY LOCATED DUMP GROUND.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEN OF THE CITY OF HUNTER, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit old cars, old car bodies, or parts of cars or other vehicles, storage batteries, manure or any refuse such as trash, paper, grass, boxes, or any commodity that may be consumed by fire, at the regularly designated dump ground.

SECTION 2. Penalty. Any person violating any of the terms or provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, before the police court of said city, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), nor less than Two Dollars (\$2.00), or imprisonment in the jail of said City for not more than Thirty (30) days, or both fine and imprisonment and such persons so convicted shall be remanded to the jail of said City until sentence of the court is fully satisfied.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official paper.
