

ORDINANCE NO. 44

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKING OF MOTOR CARS OR MOTOR VEHICLES OF WHAT-SO-EVER KIND.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEN OF THE CITY OF HUNTER, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. All motor vehicles must be parked at right angles (45 degrees) on the following designated streets: On First Street from Railroad to Victor Street; On Main Street from Railroad to Second Street; On Gaylord Street from "A" Street to Second.

SECTION 2. All vehicles shall drive to the street intersection before making a "U" turn on the following designated streets: On First Street from Main to Gaylord; On Main Street from First to Second; On Gaylord from "A" to Second.

SECTION 3. Penalty. Any person violating any of the terms or provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, before the police court of said city, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00), nor less than Two Dollars (\$2.00), or imprisonment in the jail of said City for not more than Thirty (30) Days, or both fine and imprisonment and such persons so convicted shall be remanded to the jail of said City until sentence of the court is fully satisfied.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city paper.
