

ORDINANCE NO. 46

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE EXPLOSION OF FIRECRACKERS ETC. AND THE SALE OF SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUNTER:

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to fire or explode any torpedo, firecracker, blank cartridge, squib, sky rocket, roman candle or any other explosive of any kind or character on Main street or on First street of the City of Hunter at any time, unless the city council shall by proclamation or resolution passed in regular form, permit such a course for the purpose of celebrating the anniversary of national independence or for other good cause.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons within the city limits of the City of Hunter to sell torpedoes or any other kind of fireworks before July 2nd, of any year, nor after July 4th, of any year, unless the city council shall permit such sale by special permit in regular form.

SECTION 3. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city paper.
